Phonics	<p>‘Maisie, mountain, mountain’ Introduce the sound m and the picture of the picture of Maisie and the mountains. Name the mini pictures together. Practise writing and saying the sound m. Set 1 sound m</p>	<p>‘Round the apple, down the leaf.’ Look at yesterday’s writing this was the sound m. Introduce the sound a and the picture of the apple. Name the mini pictures together. Practise writing and saying the sound a. Set 1 sound a</p>	<p>‘Slither down the snake’ Look at the writing from the previous day, practise saying the m and a sound. Introduce the sound s and the picture of the snake. Name the mini pictures together. Practise writing and saying the sound s. Set 1 sound s</p>
Mathematics	<p>Let’s Count! With your child count to 10, clap as you count, stamp your feet or click your fingers. Use some toys to practise counting with your child. These could be cars, teddy bears or a different selection. Practise counting up to 10 objects.</p>	<p>The Number 2 Sing the counting to 10 song together. Counting Song Introduce the number 2. When we write the number 2 at Nursery we say ‘wing it round and right across,’ as we write. Ask your child to get you two of different objects; two cars, two bricks, two toys.’ Practise writing 2</p>	<p>Give Me... Count to 10 with your child. Do this again in a loud voice and a quiet voice. Use a teddy bear or doll with a plate and some food items. These could be raisins, pasta or crisps. Ask your child to give the toy 5 raisins, 7 raisins, 2 raisins. Check they have given them the right amount. You could also write the number on a piece of paper when you have counted them.</p>
Wider Curriculum	<p>Colour Have a look around your home for things that are white.</p>	<p>Shape Have a look around your home for things that are a circle shape. Or go for a walk and look for circles.</p>	<p>Winter Make an igloo to hide in. Use a sheet and chairs or a table to make an igloo at home.</p>
Support for Teaching Phonics	<p>Oxford Owl have many free resources to support your child with phonics at home. We will focus on a new sound every day and review the sounds taught at the end of each week. You can print the sheets attached or practise on paper. If you can, make flashcards of the sounds taught (use A4 paper cut into 4 pieces) and keep recapping these with your child. We do not teach children in Early years letter names or capital letters we only introduce them to sounds and lower case letters at this time.
